In October, Cat Tail Acres Sanctuary was really pleased to host the Director of the Macomb County Animal Control Dept. and Shelter, Jeff Randazzo, along with two of his staffers, Aimee Orn and Sherry LaBelle, as well as Marie Skladd, the Director of Community Outreach for the Michigan Humane Society, and our newest benefactor, Addy Shattuck who owns three Pet Supplies Plus stores in Oakland County and who ran a cat food matching program at her stores for us this Fall.

Since assuming his Director position in Macomb County, Mr. Randazzo has been instituting many new efforts to help the animals of his county, notably including a free Spay/Neuter program made possible by a temporary grant. He and his staff visited our Sanctuary in order to get ideas about how to design a new room at their shelter where cats are not caged. We are gratified to have this humane-minded person now in charge at the county shelter. Marie is well known to many animal advocates in Michigan because she founded the Michigan Animal Adoption Network and the Animal Care Network that goes into the poorest and roughest neighborhoods in Oakland County to rescue neglected dogs and those used in dog fighting. Since taking her position at the MHS, she has reached out to dozens of animal rescue groups and shelters around the state to form partnerships that allow animals to be given a second chance instead of having to be humanely euthanized. Addy Shattuck has not only been an angel of grace to our Sanctuary because of all the food she and her customers donated to us, but over the decades she has helped, and continues to help, so many animals and animal rescue groups. She instituted "Kitty Cities" in her stores so formerly unwanted cats and kittens can live in a cozy environment until they are adopted. It was so terrific to have them all visit us!
